Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I hope you had a wonderful summer and had a chance to spend time with your families and friends. As I travel around the state visiting our Lodges I am again struck by the fellowship extended to my wife Bonnie and me. The willingness of each Lodge to open its arms to us is a joyous thing. As Odd Fellows we know that we will always find a warm reception the world over among our Sisters and Brothers.



One of the messages I have been bringing to the Lodges on my visits is the need to once again become relevant to our communities as the first step to revive our membership. It is interesting to look into our Order's past. Before the Civil War our Order endorsed slavery. For many years after that war we only accepted white men as members. More recently, however, we ceased excluding people based upon race or gender. But we have not actively recruited them. The truth is that we are still predominately an organization of white men. We need to open our doors and extend the hand of Odd Fellowship to those who do not look like us, who do not come from the same places in the world as ourselves, and who may not share our personal vision of the Supreme Being. The requirements to be considered for membership in our Order are that you believe in a Supreme Being, Creator and Preserver of the Universe, and are faithful to your country. We must seek out members in our community who are of good character, who share these beliefs and will vow to work together as Odd Fellows to build a better world. This is our sacred oath, passed down to us through the years by our elders, a promise we make at each Lodge meeting.

The acceptance and tolerance we practice among ourselves is a keynote of our Order. As Odd Fellows when we look at someone who isn't an Odd Fellow we do not see the color of their skin, the part of the world they came from, nor the source of their morality. We see the person they are. How do they treat other people? Are they honest and true? Do they care about others? Do they want to make the world a better place? These are the values that mark Odd Fellows. Our country today certainly isn't the one we grew up in. The values, opportunities and freedoms of our nation have attracted people from all

over the world. Please always remember – they are Americans. In the eyes of America, in the eyes of an Odd Fellow who lives by the words of our Creed, we are all part of “the Brotherhood of Man.” We need to open our Lodges to all good women and men if we are to once again be a vital part of our community.

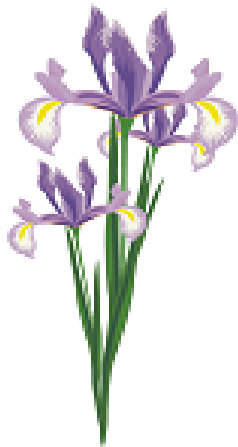

I have had several people ask about this recipe so here goes

Cabbage Salad

Roast the slivered almonds and sesame seeds until lightly brown (or on occasion darker ☺)

- Mix together:
- 4 cups shredded cabbage
 - Almond and sesame seeds
 - 4 cups chopped green onions



Break up and add: 1pkg chicken flavored Top Ramen noodles (uncooked)

Dressing

Mix and pour over salad:



- 2 Tblsp. sugar
- 4 Tblsp vinegar (white)
- 1/2 pkg seasoning from the chicken flavored noodles soup mix
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- salt and pepper to taste

A few changes I have made. I like more almonds so I add more. I have tried other vinegars and the white makes the best interaction with the ingredients. I also use olive oil and sometimes increase the amount of sugar for a sweeter taste. I have tried some of the sugar alternatives and find that they leave an after taste as well as there are those that are allergic to these other products. I also use the entire soup package. When I take it to lodge or a potluck I keep the dressings and noodles separate until I get there and then mix it all together.

The Second Degree

The Second Degree of Odd Fellowship is the one that best defines the term “fellowship” and there are few better examples to illustrate this than the parable of the Good Samaritan. It is a short lesson, but poignant in its teachings. And even more than just charity to a stranger, this parable shows us how we should behave in our everyday lives.

This lesson is from Luke 10:25-37:

On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test Jesus. “Teacher,” he asked, “what must I do to inherit eternal life?”

“What is written in the Law?” Jesus asked. “How do you read it?”

The man answered: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind”; and “Love your neighbor as yourself.”

“You have answered correctly,” Jesus replied. “Do this and you will live.”

* Please note that Jesus didn’t get mad at being questioned. He simply asked the person questioning him to think for himself and to work out the answer for himself.

But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?”

* A natural enough question: Is it the man or woman next door? What about the person down the street that you nod to in passing? What about someone from another town? Another state?

In reply Jesus said: “A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he fell into the hands of robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side.”

* Remember, this was a priest, a man sworn to uphold the tenets of the Temple, to show mercy and charity, but he didn’t want to get involved and left the injured man to live or die as he would. And this was to a man of his own faith; another Jew! *Continued page five..*

Continued from page four: “So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side.”

* A Levite was a man who performed various religious and political duties, even serving in the Temple. In other words, a man who should have been looking out for the welfare of a fellow man as ordered by his faith. But he too looked the other way.

“But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him.”

* At the time of this teaching, the Samaritans and the Jews hated each other. So what Jesus was describing was like a Pre-Civil War white man helping a black man, or a Cavalry soldier aiding an Indian; in other words, IT JUST WASN’T DONE!—and would be a shock to his listeners.

“He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, took him to an inn and took care of him.”

* Here’s a man—a stranger as well as a bitter enemy—stopping to aid a man in need and suffering only because the victim was in need. The Samaritan had nothing to gain and plenty to lose if his own countrymen learned what he had done.

The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper. “Look after him,” he said, “and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.”

* The Samaritan didn’t just take the injured man someplace where he could receive help, he cared for him personally and then he paid for extra care! Not only paying at the time, but promising to make good on any future expenses! All for a man he didn’t know—and who probably wasn’t in any shape to answer questions.

Jesus finished, “Which of these three do you think was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?”

The expert in the law replied, “The one who had mercy on him.”

Jesus told him, “Go and do likewise.”

So what does this tell us with regards to Odd Fellowship?

* Do good; not only for the people you know but for the strangers you meet, and even for strangers you never meet, as with charitable works. If you want accolades, you aren’t doing it for them.

* Offer comfort to those you meet. This may be nothing more than a friendly nod or a cheerful “Good

How to get new members? **Ask.**

Object of the Order: ‘To Improve and Elevate the Character of Mankind.’

“Odd Fellowship; How did the Name Originate”? Actually, we have no recorded history of how the name originated. We believe that the name came into being in the middle ages at a time when most people lived a “dog eat dog” existence, with every man concerned only for himself. There were a few people, however, who were concerned with helping others. These people were considered “ODD” and we believe that because of the principles of fellowship we teach and follow, we came to be known as “Odd Fellows”.

“Odd Fellowship; Where did it originate”? We do not know where the Order originated; but there are traces of it in England for centuries back, and there are traditions that show it extended far back into the mists of antiquity. However, we are not greatly concerned with the past though we are proud of it, we are more concerned with the present and future. The Order in America was founded by Thomas Wildey in Baltimore in 1819, although there were Lodges in America prior to that time.

Odd Fellowship became the first national fraternity to include both men and women when it adopted the beautiful Rebekah Degree on September 20, 1851. This degree is based on the teachings found in the Holy Bible, and was written by the Honorable Schuyler Colfax who was Vice President of the United States during the period 1868-1873. Odd Fellows and Rebekahs were also the first fraternal organization to establish homes for our senior members and for orphaned children.

“The Commands of Odd Fellowship”. The principles of practical wisdom govern Odd Fellowship and Odd Fellows and Rebekahs follow the precepts of ‘visiting the sick, relieving the distressed, burying the dead and educating the orphan’. ~ From Sovereign Grand Lodge web site

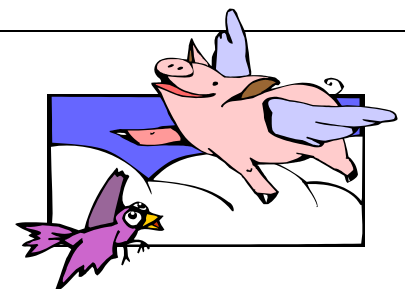
