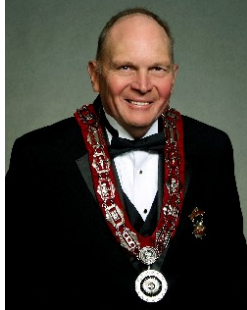

News From Jesse T. Jones Campground

Hi, I cannot believe summer has gone. Come down and check out the fall riding. The sand is great and the crowds are gone. The pavilion is a great place to hang out in the evening with a fire and friends.

The park board made a few changes to some of the rules at the August Park Board Meeting to clarify things and also to make reservations and check-in a smoother, speedier process.

They have changed the extra vehicle rate to adjust to the number of ATVs and extra people using the park. Rates are as follows extra vehicle \$4.00 (same price as before), truck with 1 ATV in back \$9.00, vehicles with more than 1 ATV or pulling a flat bed or cargo trailer will be \$15.00.

The park board has also made a ruling that all changes need to be called into the office 72 hours prior to check-in. If you come in and make the changes at check-in you can be charged an extra \$10.00. This is not a ploy to get more money but to get members to be courteous and let us know if they are canceling or adjusting their reservations so we can keep the park as full as possible. There have been many times a member has asked for a specific spot and we tell them it is not available and then they come and see that site standing open because no one called to cancel. It also takes a extra amount of time to change names, sites and guests at check-in time. We will be working with everyone and when you make a reservation we will remind you of the new policy. We do also understand emergencies.

We will continue to groom and improve the park. We do like to hear your feedback and suggestions. If you want to help just let me know, an extra hand or two is always welcome. We have projects on-going and it seems my to do list is never finished. We can still use donations for maintenance in the park. Some of our equipment like the pump systems are getting old and their repair and maintenance use a lot of the budget. Any donations that you give will help with finishing the fence, and all the other smaller projects we have. If anyone has a refrigerator they no longer need and that is in really good condition, we could use one in the pavilion.

We are looking forward to a great fall and we have a busy Thanksgiving booked this year.

Again, I want to thank everyone for coming down and sharing their vacations and families with us.

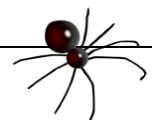

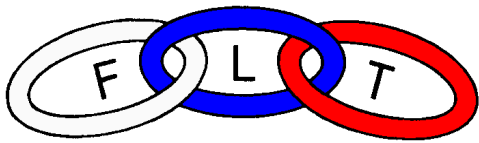

How To Get And Keep New Members

The getting new members is a simple process. You ask the person to join, they fill out an application, the application is processed and the member is initiated and works through the Degrees. Simple? Well, the hard part of that is getting the member interested. How do we do that? We will take this step by step over the next couple of articles.

First, you cannot sell your product if you do not know your product. There is something special about the Lodge that has made you stay in. What is that aspect? Start with what makes you a member, why you keep coming to the meetings. Then think how you can tell (sell) Lodge to someone who does not know anything about the Lodge. Not enough information? Well, then think about the person who you are inviting to join. Are they active outdoor people? Would they enjoy the campgrounds? Do they have children or grandchildren who may be needing scholarships or student loans? Tell them about the Educational Foundation. If the children are High School age tell them about the United Nations Pilgrimage. If the suggestions do not apply find out what their interests are. If they like to get involved with the community what activities does your Lodge do that might fit? If your Lodge is not involved in the community, let them know you could get involved, but you need a person with passion for the cause to chair that particular project. We would love to have your assistance in accomplishing this. Between the many projects of the Order, and the opportunities in the communities, there must be some common ground you can build on to initiate the conversation. Once the conversation begins invite the prospective member to a potluck or an event the Lodge is having. Introduce them around and talk of the events or plans the Lodge has. The Holidays are upon us and there should be several opportunities for invitations to non-members to see what the Lodges are doing. If not a formal activity then invite them to a potluck or dinner for family and fellowship time together.

Work on this and next month we will talk about how to keep members once we get them into our Lodges. If anyone has questions or needs clarification on anything, please contact me. I am always happy to help in any way I can.

Sheridan United Youth No. 2 begin their journey!

Three years ago, a desire to make changes in the youth of her community, Tammy Turpin spoke with several Odd Fellows including her father Roger Schaff and with the assistance of then Vice President Babe Bogear put a process in motion. Early in February, Dan Mathews presented the United Youth Program as a positive alternative. Although a contingent of young people sharing the same desires had begun some fund raising, how to make it a viable and community oriented group was illusive. They found that the United Youth program fit the need and on July 21st 2014 potential members met together with President Shirley Mathews, Coordinator Dan Mathews, PP Babe Bogear, several parents and members of Sheridan No. 87 to formalize a plan. Tammy Turpin would become the group's Senior Advisor with several Odd Fellow members- assistant advisors. Sunday afternoon, Hillsboro Youth No. 2 arrived with their advisors Liz and John Penney to assist Dan Mathews, Master of Ceremonies. Grand Master Ron Kunze and President Shirley with the help of Patricia Fries, PCP Pearlle Stewart, and Grand Warden Jody Morris - Sheridan United Youth No. 2 IOOF – Jurisdiction of Oregon became official.
