

The Laptop Award for Community Service program is important to Peninsula Lodge and helps to highlight the focus that we place on education, as well as community service initiatives. In keeping with the mission of community service, this award focuses solely on a student's community service efforts.

Applications are sent to schools in the Portland and Vancouver area each April, with applications due in early May.

## UNEP Delegates Ready To Go!

The 24 Oregon UNEP Delegates are ready to leave for the East Coast and will travel with the 4 delegates from Washington. Their trip begins with a Send-Off dinner at the Holgate Center at 6pm, July 10th and you are invited! Saturday, July 11<sup>th</sup> they fly out of PDX and go to Philadelphia. The local lodge there, Walker Lodge, goes way out of the way to host delegates. Every year they provide lodging, meals and tours in Philadelphia. Great job! Sunday evening they head north to New York City for 5 nights. In NYC they will visit the U.N. building for 3 days along with touring the Empire State Building, 911 Memorial, Rockefeller Center, Battery Park, Liberty Island, and Ellis Island. They will also see a Broadway Play "Something Rotten" (which sounds very funny) and give their speeches. After leaving NYC they will head north and tour the Corning Glass Museum (which is very popular with the delegates), Ottawa, Niagara Falls, Gettysburg, and Washington D.C. They are scheduled to arrive back at PDX on Friday, July 24<sup>th</sup> at 9:00pm. This year's trip is a bit later, which is a great thing. By moving it to a time after July 4<sup>th</sup>, they were able to make the trip one day longer than in the past for the same cost.

Thank you to everyone who supports this program. The 2015 year appears to be a total success. Of course... it is now time to plan for the 2016 tour! I will be posting information in the OPOF and on our website. But please contact me if you need any other information. We will not know the exact costs and deadlines until September. However we expect the dates and costs to be about the same as this past year. For 2015 the cost for an area or lodge to send each delegate was \$1,800. December 1<sup>st</sup> was the deadline for \$900 per delegate plus the names of the delegates. February 14<sup>th</sup> was the deadline for the balance due (another \$900). That means right now is a good time to start planning. I recommend contacting schools in September and/or October. Then have your competition in November. Every student **MUST** write an essay on the topic the state committee will provide. No exceptions! This topic will be posted online and in the August OPOF.


